


1. Alfred Henry Lewis Nation-Famous New York Murders *New York G W Dillingham 1914*




3. Arthur Garfield Hays Trial By Prejudice *New York Covici Friede 1933*


4. Craig Rice (editor) Los Angeles Murders *New York Duell Sloan & Pearce 1947*


5. **Donald John Giese** *The Carol Thompson Murder Case* *New York Scope Reports* 1969


6. **Dorothy L Sayers** *Detection Mystery Horror Part 4* *London Victor Gollancz* 1952


7. **Edgar Lustgarten** *Verdict in Dispute* *New York Charles Scribner's Sons* 1950

8. **Edward Beal** *The Trial of Adelaide Bartlett for Murder* *London Stevens & Haynes* 1886



9. George Dilnot *The Trial of the Detectives* New York Charles Scribner's Sons 1928



10. George W Walling *Recollections of a New York Chief of Police* New York Caxton Book Concern 1888






11. Georges Simenon *Act Of Passion* London Routledge & Kegan Paul 1953


12. Georges Simenon *The Night Club* London Hamish Hamilton 1979



14. Georges Simenon Three Beds In Manhattan London Hamish Hamilton 1976



15. Georges Simenon Ticket of Leave London Routledge & Kegan Paul 1954




First edition in a dust jacket. Translated from the French by John Petrie.
